

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTIONS 1191.03(C), 1191.03(D) AND 1191.10 OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF ASHLAND, OHIO, RELATIVE TO THE HISTORIC PRESERVATION BOARD; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the Ohio Historic Preservations Office has established minimum requirements for local legislation for certification of local governments; and

WHEREAS, additional provisions to Chapter 1191 – Historic Preservation Board are required for such certification; and

WHEREAS, in order to qualify as a “certified local government,” at the earliest possible time, this Ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, property, health, safety and welfare of said City of Ashland, Ohio; now therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Ashland, Ohio, 4 members thereto concurring:

Section 1. That Chapter 1191 – Historic Preservation Board of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Ashland, Ohio be, and the same is hereby, amended as follows:

§1191.03(c) Vacancies on the Historic Preservation Board shall be filled within sixty (60) days, unless extenuating circumstances require a longer period. An extension may be given in writing upon petition of the City.

§1191.03(d) Historic Preservation Board shall conduct or encourage Board Members to attend training/educational sessions at least once a year or in-depth consultation with the Ohio Historic Preservation Office pertaining to work and functions of the Board or on specific historic preservation issues. Barring extenuating circumstances, all Board Members should attend such a session at least once yearly. The Ohio Historic Preservation Office will provide orientation materials and training for the Board.

§1191.10 Meetings
A written annual report shall be prepared by the Board of the Historic Preservation Board’s activities, cases, decisions, special projects and qualifications of the Board Members, etc. and such report shall be kept on file and available for public inspection.

Section 2. That in order to qualify as a “certified local government,” at the earliest possible time, this Ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, property, health, safety and welfare of said City of Ashland, Ohio.

Section 3. That this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage by Council and approval pursuant to Section 12 of the Charter of the City of Ashland, Ohio.
